The homeowner of this 1906 Queen Anne style home came to us with two goals: the complete restoration of his home's original exterior that would be maintenance free. Over the years the exterior wood siding, trim and original slate were beginning to rot, crumble or rust. The renovation process involved replacement of most of the windows, siding, soffit, fascia, gutter system, roof, brick chimney repair and replacement as well as porch ceilings and exterior lighting.

A combination of ABC Seamless steel siding, Mastic perfection vinyl shakes and metal trim was used for the exterior renovation. Polaris Energy Weld vinyl windows were installed and the slate roof was replaced with Arrowline, 28 gauge metal slate roofing from EDCO Products.

Seamless steel siding provided a clean, clapboard look. The combination of seamless in bold, dark colors & vinyl restoration style shakes provide contrasting textures that replicate the original exterior design. 30 gauge metal trim allowed for precise, crisp lines.

Vinyl railing was heated, then formed to the exact radius of the original wood rail at all the gables.

The existing gutters had been replaced in the past and were neither attractive nor functional due to improper pitch and awkward downspout placement. A new system, designed by extending the roof sheathing and building a new fascia, maintained the gutter system without obscuring the ornate trim.

Powder coated stainless steel chimney caps from Olympia and an aluminum vintage warehouse style outdoor wall light completed the transformation.




